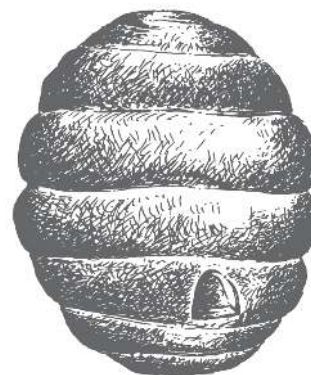

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## NATURALLY DYED YARNS FROM WHY KNOT FIBERS



This **Friday (August 4th) from 6 to 8 pm**, we're hosting a **Why Knot Fibers** trunk show at Wool & Honey, where local dyers Kat and Claire will be showcasing a naturally dyed rainbow of handpainted yarns, grown, spun and dyed in Michigan.

From madder to indigo, alkanet to cochineal, these yarns are a spin-off of the traditional yarns we're used to seeing on the shelves of yarn shops.

Time-consuming and sometimes temperamental due to pH levels and temperatures of soil, water and foraged plants, naturally-dyed yarns are extremely special; these plant-dyed yarns allow the maker to experience a deeper connection to the natural environment around them.
