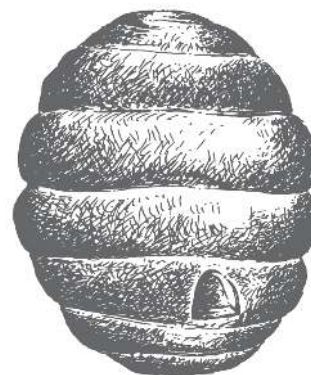

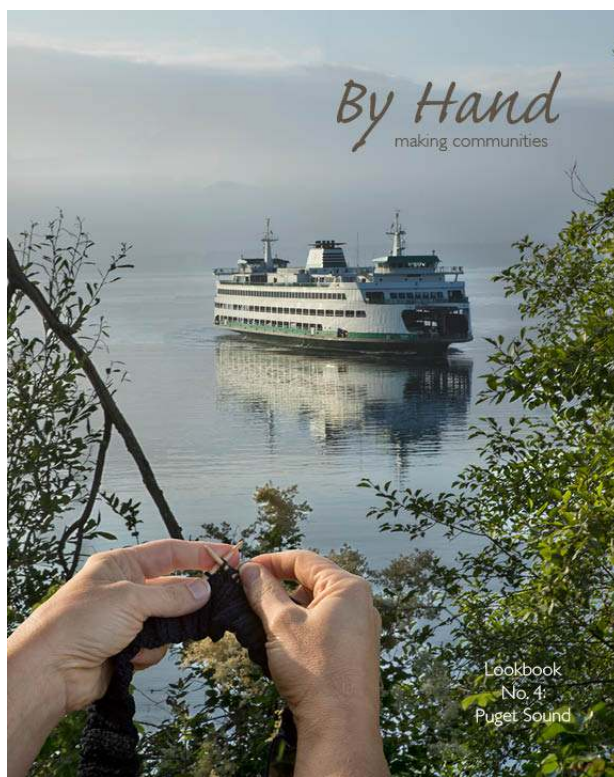

Each of these geographic "clusters" has its own unique characteristics, and those characteristics influence the artists who live and work there.





The fourth issue of By Hand Magazine features the creativity and community of the Puget Sound Region. We travel from the Snoqualmie Valley to Bellingham Bay, from the south sound islands of Whidbey and Bainbridge, to busy downtown Seattle. 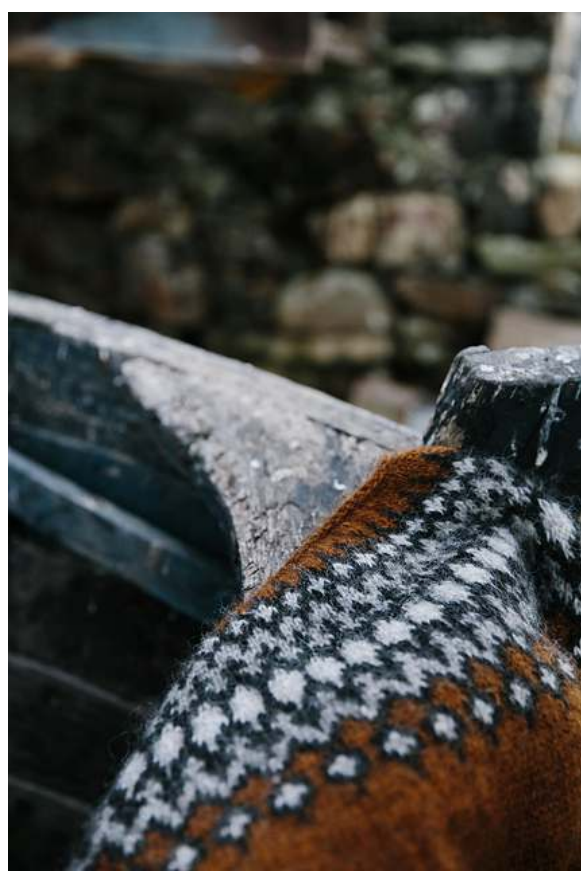
